ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

Overall Cognitive Ability: Full scale IQ must be within the average range.

Academic Skills:

Primary (Kindergarten & 1st Grade):

Student must demonstrate concept of numbers from one to ten, phonological awareness, print awareness and alphabet knowledge, including letter recognition.

Elementary Program (2nd thru 6th Grade):

Results of Reading and Math evaluations cannot be more than two grade levels behind.

Verbal Ability: Student must demonstrate oral communication skills. (Highpoint Academy is not an appropriate educational setting for students who are non-verbal.)

Diagnosis: Specific Learning Disabilities, Attention Deficit Disorder, PDD-NOS, High Functioning Autism & Asperger's Syndrome.

Social/Behavioral:

Highpoint Academy is not an appropriate educational setting for students manifesting any aggressive, self-injurious or violent behaviors.
